1 Objective

2 Introduction

Catholicate College, Pathanamthitta founded in 1952, has a rich legacy of almost seven decades in redefining higher education and revitalizing the academic aspirations of the region. The institution is affiliated to Mahatma Gandhi University, Kottayam and is guided by the motto "Fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom." It imparts valuebased education aimed at the holistic and intuitive growth of the individual to fulfil the vision of creating an educated and enlightened society. Sprawling across a lush ecofriendly campus, the college has an impressive infrastructure which houses fourteen departments, eight research centres and offers fourteen PG Courses, thirteen UG Courses, five Self Financing Courses and a number of Add-on Courses to complement the conventional courses. In the third phase of NAAC re-accreditation, the college has been reaccredited by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council in A+ Grade with a CGPA of 3.60.

The Student Satisfaction Survey was conducted in May 2020 by the Internal Quality Assurance Cell to improve quality of the college by incorporating inputs from the students. The survey was conducted based on a questionnaire, designed using the online survey administration suite, Google Forms. The responses to the questions were collected on a four-point scale. The findings of the survey are analysed in the following sections of the document.
