1. INTRODUCTION

The college was formally inaugurated on August 6th 1952 by the Honorable Raja Pramukh of Travancore - Cochin, H.E. (late) Sri. ChithiraThirunal Raja Raja Varma. The most virtuous H.H. BaseliusGeevarghese II laid the foundation of this educational institution on the serene hilltop at Makkamkunnu, west of Pathanamthitta town, Kerala. In 1952 the college was affiliated to the university of Travancore, then University of Kerala. Now it is affiliated to Mahatma Gandhi University Kottayam. The college upholds the motto "The Fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom" with the vision 'To create an educated enlightened society for a brave new world'. The primary objective of the college is to provide an academic and social environment in which students can flourish. The management focuses mainly on imparting value-based education through quality teaching and learning which is aimed at the holistic and intuitive growth of the individual. In all levels, teaching and non-teaching staff and also students cooperate in an atmosphere of mutual respect to realize the vision and mission of the institution. The college secured Christian minority institution status on 2012 from the Govt. of India.

10. INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOUCES

Catholicate College aims towards holistic development of the students. It offers both the physical and learning facilities required to support 13 U.G courses, 16 P.G courses, 8 research centres, 3 Academic Chairs and 2 Add- on courses.

The Academic Blocks are:

- The Science Block: Chemistry, Physics, Botany & Zoology
- Mar Dionysius Block– Mathematics, English, History
- •St.Thomas Silver Jubilee Block- Hindi, Malayalam
- •St.Mary's Block- Economics
- Administrative Block– Commerce, Physical Education
- H.G. Daniel Mar Philoxenos Diamond Jubilee Block- BCA

There are 67 classrooms, 11 HOD rooms and 14 staff rooms. All rooms are well equipped, and Wifi enabled. The Golden Jubilee Library and the departmental libraries function as brain boosters. The 18 science laboratories (separately set up UG,PGand

Research) are safe and modern. There are 8 computer labs in the campus. All Departments are technologically updated and connected to the Public Address System. An uninterrupted power supply is provided via a transformer.

Other facilities available in the campus are 2 Seminar/Conference Halls with centralised AC, one mini Digital and two Science Theatres, a multifunctional NUHRO language lab, Botanical Garden and Museum, Ginger House, Phycotechnology Lab, Zoology Museum, and Sophia Counselling Centre. IGNOU study centre and Rutronix centre are also available to students.

Cultural activities are conducted in the Heritage Auditorium, Open Auditorium, or departmental seminar halls. Faculty Members nominated as Staff Advisors to the College Union, Arts Club, and the Editorial Board of the College Magazine oversee their activities.

The student centre is available to students to meet and organize activities.

Infrastructure Facility for Physical Education:

Catholicate College has the facilities to cater to active sports culture in the campus. Training is provided to students in various sports under the supervision of two permanent Physical Education faculties and the aegis of Kerala Sports Council andDistrict Sports Council. The college conducts an annual Sports Day and intra-mural competitive events, from which participants are selected for University, State andNational level competitions.

The College has facilities for outdoor (Football, Volleyball, Basketball, and Badminton courts and a 200-meter track) as well as indoor games (Caroms, Chess, Table Tennis, Judo, Fencing, TaekWondo, Weight Lifting and Power Lifting). There are two pavilions, a gymnasium and a Yoga hall. The Health and Fitness Clubs work alongside the Physical Education Department. Health Centre oversees the Amenity Centre and first-aid.

Library:

College library is fully automated and books are well maintained, barcoded and issued using computer software. The library has a good collection of book in all the subjects & updated with changes in the syllabus. The officials of the library guide the users about the collections in the library using OPAC/ webOPAC. Library kiosk machine provides easy search modules to access Catalogued books, New arrivals, Periodical links etc. The computer section with high speed nodes/ terminals gives uninterrupted access to NLIST project.


IT facilities

The college is powered with sufficient computer facility. A total of 147 computers with memory of 2GB or more RAM and a capacity of minimum 250 GB Hard disk are installed at various locations. The students and teachers are provided with free internet facility in the library. The students are permitted to access the internet provided in the Departments also. All the departments can access the internet with the Wi-Fi provided by the office using routers. Devices such as GIGA POE switch Net gear, access point devices and routers help in providing uninterrupted internet connectivity inside the campus. All the students are provided with INFLIBNET facility. Research students are beneficiaries of ICT in pursuing advanced research and publication by the utilization of close to 6000 e-journals through INFLIBNET. Licensed Software such as MS OFFICE, WINDOWS, TALLY, PEACHTREE, MATHEMATICA, SPSS, FIREFLY, PHYSIO EX, MATLAB, SOLVER SUITE, ORIGIN, TELL ME MORE etc., are used. A Centralized printing and scanning facility is available for the smooth conduct of internal exams and other reprographic requirements of the departments. The College organizes orientation programmes for students and teachers to familiarize them with the latest ICT technology in teaching -learning process. ICT enabled technology and power point is being used by the students for their Seminar and paper presentations. ICT is promoted in library and administration by making available requisite hardware and software in areas like payroll, student database, results, library catalogue, security, connectivity, etc. Outsourcing is done for maintenance and repairing of IT infrastructure such as computers, wifi facility etc. The institution plans to increase the student to computer ratio from 15:1 to 6:1 and to increase the broad band access speed from 200 MBPS to higher level.


